CHECKLIST FOR CERTIFICATE OF NO IMPEDIMENT TO MARRIAGE

IMPORTANT: This document has to be submitted along with your application, to confirm that you have read and provided all of the necessary documents. This is a mandatory requirement. Failure to adhere to these requirements will lead to your application being rejected.

Note:

- 1.) Every Kenyan wishing to marry abroad has to apply for a Certificate of No Impediment to Marriage from the nearest Kenyan Mission. Marriages conducted without issuance of this Certificate are neither recognized by the Mission nor the Authorities in Kenya.
- 2.) The Kenya constitution neither acknowledges nor endorses same-sex unions. Certificates are therefore not issued for such unions.
- 3.) Do not indicate your marital status on Section 11 of the application form as *Single*. Enter either *Spinster, Bachelor, Widowed or Divorced*.
- 4.) You are required to enter Sublocation, location and district in Section 3 and 5 of the application Form No. 7 and either mother or father's detail on No. 5.
- 5.) Enter your last P.O. Box or full residential address in Kenya in Section 9 of Form No. 7.
- 6.) All Photocopies MUST be certified by a notary public.
- 7.) Scanned documents will not be accepted.

Processing: The issuance process could take up to 3 months or more.



The application **MUST** contain ALL of the following:

- Two (2)** sets of Application Form properly filled.
- Two (2)** photocopies of Kenyan applicant's current passport-pages with all official entries. These passport copies have to be certified by a **notary public**.
- Two (2)** photocopies of Kenyan birth certificate. The birth certificate copies have to be certified by a **notary public**.
- Two (2)** photocopies of Fiance/Fiancee's passport. These photocopies have to be certified by a **notary public**.
- For divorced / widowed Kenyas: **Two (2)** photocopies of supporting documents (2 copies of English translation) ie. Divorce decree or the late spouse's death certificate. The divorce decree/death certificate copies have to be certified by a **notary public**.
